COVID-19 UPDATE

June 14, 2020

COVID-19 has affected how we commute, shop, work, and interact with each other. The City of Opa-locka executed a State of Emergency for the City in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. While there are no vaccines to prevent COVID-19, the Centers for Disease Control and the Florida Department of Health have issued safety guidelines to help limit spreading the virus. We ask that you continue to adhere to the safety guidelines currently in place.

On June 13, 2020 the City of Opa-locka Police Department did not receive any medical calls related to COVID-19. The Police Department issued 19 warnings to individuals for not wearing face masks at 400 Fisherman Street, 2105 Ali-Baba Avenue, 2891 NW 135th Street, 101 Opa-locka Boulevard, 15055 NW 22nd Avenue, and 14711 NW 22nd Avenue. In addition, 57 warnings were given to individuals for not adhering to social distancing at 2891 NW 135th Street, 101 Opa-locka Boulevard, 400 Fisherman Street, 2105 Ali-Baba Avenue, 1326 Peri Street, and 14711 NW 22nd Avenue. Four non COVID-19 arrests were made at different locations throughout the City.

Direct patrol was conducted at several apartment complexes within the City.

Business checks were conducted and all were in compliance.

The COVID-19 Testing Site in the City of Opa-locka processed 93 tests on June 14, 2020.
